1. Purpose and Relationship

This Cookie Policy explains how BIG-ABE websites and related digital services may use browser technologies, cookies, analytics, session technologies, local storage, authentication technologies, security technologies, and related digital tracking mechanisms. It is designed to explain technologies and user choices, not to replace the Privacy Policy or Website Terms of Use.

Browser technologies may help BIG-ABE operate digital services, maintain security, remember limited preferences, understand website performance, support authentication and reliable sessions, and improve customer experience.

Some browser technologies may support customer portal access, scheduling, payment workflows, QR code destinations, authentication, and session continuity.

2. Browser Technologies Covered

Browser technologies may include cookies, local storage, session storage, IndexedDB, pixels, tags, device or browser identifiers, browser caches, authentication tokens, security tokens, logs, analytics identifiers, and similar technologies that may be stored on or read from a browser, device, or application environment.

BIG-ABE uses category-based descriptions because specific technologies, names, and configurations may change as digital services evolve.

BIG-ABE maintains an internal inventory of browser technologies, consent mechanisms, and related controls used to support its digital services. The public descriptions in this Cookie Policy summarize those internal controls and may not identify every individual technology currently in use.

3. Representative Categories

The following table provides representative examples. It is not a technical inventory of every cookie, storage item, tag, or token used at any given time.

Category	Representative examples	Purpose	Control notes
Strictly necessary	Session cookie; authentication token; load-balancing value; service availability flag	Operate forms, customer portal access, scheduling, payments, QR destinations, authentication, routing, site navigation, and reliable digital-service sessions.	Blocking these may impair website operation.
Preference	Language setting; region choice; remembered form state	Remember user choices or settings if preference features are enabled.	May usually be cleared or limited through browser settings.
Analytics	Site measurement tag; interaction event; referral-source measurement	Measure usability, performance, reliability, traffic patterns, and aggregate interaction trends.	May be controlled through browser settings, consent tools if deployed, or applicable opt-out mechanisms.
Security	CSRF token; session-validation token; authentication challenge; bot-detection signal; rate-limiting value	Protect forms, prevent abuse, validate sessions, support authentication, detect suspicious activity, and maintain service integrity.	Some controls may be necessary for security and reliability.

4. Analytics, Consent, and User Choices

Analytics technologies, if used, are intended to help BIG-ABE improve usability, performance, reliability, and digital-service design. They are not intended for individual customer profiling, marketing retargeting, or sale of personal information.

When consent is required by applicable law or BIG-ABE policy, BIG-ABE will request consent before placing non-essential cookies or similar browser technologies where applicable. When deployed, BIG-ABE's cookie banner or consent manager will allow users to accept, reject, or manage non-essential browser technologies as required by applicable law.

Visitors may use browser or device settings to delete cookies, block cookies, allow cookies, limit storage technologies, or control site permissions. Blocking some technologies may affect website functionality, security, forms, preferences, or session reliability.

BIG-ABE will evaluate browser-based privacy signals, including Global Privacy Control or similar browser privacy signals, where applicable and technically supported.

5. Security and Service Integrity

BIG-ABE digital services may use security and authentication technologies to protect visitors, customers, systems, and service workflows. These technologies may include CAPTCHA, bot detection, fraud prevention, portal login support, session validation, session continuity, rate limiting, browser cache controls, logs, security tokens, and similar controls.

Security and authentication technologies may process technical data such as IP address, device or browser data, request logs, session identifiers, authentication status, interaction events, and security events as needed to detect abuse, maintain reliability, investigate incidents, validate authorized access, and protect digital services.

6. Third-Party Technologies

Third-party tools, platforms, embedded content, payment workflows, communications tools, security services, analytics services, or infrastructure providers may set or read their own cookies or related technologies. BIG-ABE does not necessarily control third-party technology settings, retention periods, or privacy practices.

Users should review the privacy, cookie, and technology notices of relevant third-party services when those services are used or made available through BIG-ABE digital services.

7. Changes and Contact

BIG-ABE may update this Cookie Policy when browser technologies, analytics practices, authentication technologies, security technologies, consent tools, privacy signals, legal requirements, third-party services, or customer channels materially change.

Appendix A - Definitions

The following definitions are provided for this Cookie Policy and should be read consistently with the BIG-ABE Privacy Policy and Website Terms of Use.

Term	Meaning
Cookie	A small file or value that may be stored on or read from a browser, device, or application environment.
Local Storage	Browser storage that may retain information until deleted by the user, browser, website, or application process.

Term	Meaning
Session Storage	Browser storage generally used for a single browsing session, tab, or limited interaction period.
Analytics	Measurement technologies used to understand website use, usability, performance, reliability, and interaction trends.
Strictly Necessary	Technologies needed to operate a digital service, maintain security, authenticate users where applicable, route requests, validate sessions, or support core functionality.
Preference	Technologies used to remember limited user choices or settings when those features are enabled.
Security Technology	Controls such as CAPTCHA, bot detection, fraud prevention, CSRF protection, session validation, rate limiting, logs, and security tokens.
Global Privacy Control	A browser-based privacy signal that may communicate a user's privacy preference to websites that can recognize and process the signal.
Browser Setting	A user-controlled browser, device, or application setting that may allow, block, delete, or limit cookies, storage, site permissions, or related technologies.
Authentication Technology	Browser or session technologies that help validate login status, maintain session continuity, protect portal access, or confirm authorized use of digital-service workflows.
